

We tend to get caught up in the romantic love that the season represents, but there’s another kind of love that needs to be celebrated—the unconditional love that God has for us.

### Work Out

This song is a great reminder for us of the unconditional love God pours out on us every day. We don’t deserve His love, but He gives it to us anyway. My favorite part of the song says this:

keeps no records of wrongs. It is patient and kind. It is not proud. It does not boast. It rejoices in the truth. It is hopeful. It endures all things, it bears all things and it never, ever fails (1 Corinthians 13:4-8).
