

His Touch *(presentation helps and ideas)*

Music:

“He Touched Me,” “The Touch of the Master’s Hand.”

As a special, enlist a teen or young person to sign (using ASL—American Sign Language) a fitting song.

Presentation:

Begin with the classic poem, “The Touch of the Master’s Hand.” Invite a musician, artist, health professional or someone who “touches” others’ lives through the power of His touch to share their craft or ministry.

Or supply flower cutouts (see craft idea below) with paint or ink pads and let each woman create a thumbprint flower, adding a thumbprint petal as the presenter covers each part of the study (thumbprint for the flower center could be used as either the introduction or conclusion, guiding women to personally consider His Touch on their lives).

Since the Isaiah 6 passage is such a powerful one, be sure to include it in your presentation. Read it aloud together, have someone read this aloud in dramatic form, either singularly or as a Reader’s Theatre. Better yet, have someone read it as an interpreter for the deaf signs it.

Craft:

Make a thumbprint bouquet (<http://pinterest.com/pin/34199278390865009/>) for shut-ins or others, reminding them that His Touch is still on their lives and you are wanting to touch their lives.

Decorations:

Decorate with the thumbprint bouquets described above or use children’s hand art decorations (supplied from your children’s church or nursery class). Or if available, decorate with stringed instruments. Another option (especially for a women’s banquet event) would be to decorate with ladies’ gloves.

Prayer:

Conduct a circle of prayer, touching Heaven with the needs of your families, church, and community and seeking the touch of God upon each woman’s life.
